Website Evaluation Skill

As nurses, we have good critical-thinking skills. It is important to use them to their fullest when evaluating information found on the WWW. A simple mnemonic we can use to get a quick handle on "the good, the bad, and the ugly" that exists on the web is: To determine if you are **PLEASED** with the site.

P-Purpose: What is the author's purpose in developing the site? Are the author's objectives clear? Another hint to the purpose: decipher the uniform resource locator (URL). GOV is the domain for a government agency; EDU is for an educational institution, ORG for an organization, COM for a commercial service, MIL for the military, and NET for a network service.

L-Links: Are the links off the site functioning? Do they lead to reliable sites?

E-Editorial: (site content) Is the information contained in the site accurate, comprehensive and current? Is there a particular bias or is the information presented in an objective way? Also assess who is the site designed for: health professionals, patients, consumers or other audiences? Is the information appropriate for its audience? Are there misspellings and grammatical errors?

A-Author: Who is the author of the site? Does that person or persons have the appropriate credentials? Is the author clearly identified by name, and is contact information provided?

S-Site: (style and Functionality) Is the site easy to navigate? Is it attractive? Does it download quickly or have too many graphics and other features that make it inefficient?

E-Ethical: Is there contact information for the site developer and author? Is there full disclosure of who the author is and the purpose of the site?

D-Date: When was the site last updated? Is it current? Is the information something that needs to be updated regularly. Generally health care information should be updated every 12 to 18 months.
